

## Scholarships, Prizes, and Bursaries

St Mark's College seeks to inspire the pursuit of academic excellence and the development of good character and commitment to community service in all its students, and to ensure that, as far as possible, financial need is not a barrier to gaining the benefits of an all-round collegiate education at St Mark's.

Through the generosity of our collegians, friends and other benefactors, St Mark's is able to provide financial assistance, including scholarships, prizes and bursaries, to a total value of over \$500,000 for new and existing students each year. Usually over 50% of our students received some form of financial assistance from the College.

Awards are made to new and returning students on the basis of academic excellence, financial need, commitment to serving the community, leadership potential, and extra-curricular activities. Criteria vary between scholarships.

To apply for a scholarship, please complete the scholarship application form available from the College <u>website</u>. Only one form is required per applicant – the scholarship panel will review your application and consider you for all scholarships, prizes, and bursaries for which you may be eligible. Additional information is required for students applying for the A. Simpson & Sons Scholarship, the Craig Family Scholarship, and the Robin Ashwin Scholarship – details are provided on the application form.

Many of our scholarships and prizes have been made possible through the generosity of alumni of the College who have been deeply grateful for the opportunities that St Mark's has given them, conscious that these opportunities have been made possible through the earlier generosity of others, and committed to handing on those opportunities to future generations of students. We hope that all members of the College, being grateful, will in time do their best to support those who come after them.

We are also very grateful to the many friends of the College who, seeing the life-changing opportunities it can offer, have given generously to support scholarships to enable talented students to gain the benefits of being at St Mark's.

All students who receive scholarships from the College are asked to write a letter of gratitude to the donor/s of their scholarship/s. These letters are very much appreciated by donors.

A R LeMessurier Scholarship	The scholarship is awarded on the basis of personal character, intellectual ability, leadership and sportsmanship to a student studying a medical course (usually in their second year). It was endowed by Mr Roy LeMessurier.
A. Simpson & Sons Scholarship	<ul> <li>The A. Simpson &amp; Sons Scholarship was created in 2022 through a generous endowment by Mr Antony Simpson, Honorary Fellow of the College and Governor of the St Mark's College Foundation.</li> <li>The Scholarship is awarded annually by the College on the basis of excellence in intellect, character, leadership, and service, and to give the recipient(s) of the Scholarship the opportunity to attend the College. The following factors are taken into account in the selection of Simpson Scholars: <ul> <li>a. Assessment of excellence in intellect, which will include consideration of academic potential and motivation (as well as achievement to date) and be open to "late bloomers".</li> <li>b. Assessment of excellence in character, as reflected in behaviour and motivation, which will include an expectation that the Scholar will show thoughtfulness to others, including an aptitude for bringing others together for the benefit of all, a consistent work ethic, and character in the face of adversity.</li> </ul> </li> <li>c. Assessment of excellence in leadership, which will include an expectation that the Scholar will contribute to their community, be it within their school or the College or the consideration of the extent to which candidates for the Scholarship are innovative and show an ability to think outside established precedents.</li> <li>e. Assessment of excellence in service.</li> <li>f. In the awarding of the Scholarship, no particular regard is to be paid to sporting achievement, contribution or ability.</li> <li>g. Assessment of the Scholar's financial circumstances such that, without the benefit of the Scholarship, no particular regard is to be paid to sporting achievement, contribution or ability.</li> <li>g. Assessment of the Scholar's financial circumstances such that, without the benefit of the Scholarship, the applicant would be unable to attend the College.</li> </ul>

	The A. Simpson & Sons Scholarship is open both to new and to returning students of the College, regardless of gender, and to students studying in any discipline. It is awarded for a single year (subject to the Scholar remaining in residence for that year) and may be awarded to an individual more than once, on the basis of the selection criteria set out above. The names of the A. Simpson & Sons Scholars will be recorded on an honour board in the Junior Common Room.
Alfred Lendon Scholarship	This scholarship is awarded to a second, third or fourth-year medical student who has achieved outstanding results in their examinations.
Allister McLeod Bursaries	Allister McLeod Bursaries are awarded to students of good character and good academic results, who are also strong in sports.
Alumni Scholarship	The Alumni Scholarships were established in the 1960s, originally by the College Club. The awards are based upon contribution to the College and financial circumstances.
Archie McArthur Scholarship	The Archie McArthur Scholarship is awarded to a new student who has gained acceptance into the Bachelor of Engineering at the University of Adelaide, and who is from a rural or regional background. The selection will also involve consideration of the student's contribution to their school and potential to contribute to the College, and their interest in music. The scholarship has been established in honour of the late Archibald John McArthur OAM (St Mark's 1940-41 & 1946-48) by his daughter, Mrs Mary Lou Simpson OAM.
BP Wait Prize	This prize dates back to 1939 and was named after a long-term resident tutor, Mr B P Wait, who lived and taught at the College in the late 1920s and 1930s. This prize is given to the best student of the year in Classics or Modern Languages – which were the subjects that Mr Wait taught.
Bursaries for student leaders	The College awards a significant number of bursaries in recognition of the contribution made by students in leadership positions, such as Assistant Deans, Residential Advisors, Academic Coordinators, and other roles. Since 2021, bursaries have also been offered to members of the College Club Committee.
Cater Care Scholarship	The Cater Care Scholarship is awarded to St Mark's students who demonstrate outstanding academic performance.

Craig Family Scholarship	The Craig Family Scholarship is awarded to a rural student of good character and academic merit who is in financial need and has demonstrated resilience in facing and overcoming hardship of some kind. It is open to students of any discipline. One Scholarship will be awarded annually to a new or returning student who is or will be studying at Adelaide University (or a successor institution), to enable and support them to be at St Mark's. At the discretion of the College, the major part of the award will be used to assist in payment of College fees, and part provided to the Scholar as a direct payment to assist with other living costs (ordinarily, the Scholarship will cover 50% of the St Mark's residential fee, with a further 50% of that amount paid to the Scholar). It is awarded for a single year (subject to the Scholar remaining in residence for that year). Previous recipients of the Scholarship are eligible to apply in subsequent scholarship rounds. The Craig Family Scholarship was created in 2024 through a generous endowment by the family of Dr Robert J. Craig OAM (St Mark's 1954-58) in honour of Dr Craig, and also in recognition of the crucial role that scholarships played in creating opportunities for future generations of students. In 2025, the Scholarship will have a value of \$18,000 and is open to any student of the University of Adelaide who meets the membership requirements for St Mark's College.
David & Margaret Pank Scholarship	This scholarship was established in 1982 and is awarded to a student in College with a disability or with special needs.
Don Laidlaw Prize	This prestigious award was endowed by the Honourable Don Laidlaw and is awarded to the most outstanding second year student/s returning for a third year in College. Award is based on academic merit and contribution to the College.
Edward A Radcliff Scholarship	The Edward A Radcliff Scholarship was established in 1953 and is awarded in recognition of the best academic performance in a previous year by a returning student.
Foundation Scholarships	Funds raised through the efforts of the St Mark's College Foundation provide for one or more scholarship awarded on the basis of academic merit, financial need, community service, leadership, and musical or sporting or other extra-curricular activities.

G Angas Parsons Scholarship	The G Angas Parsons Scholarship is awarded for outstanding academic performance by one or more returning student, and is regarded as being for the runner-up or runners-up to the winner of the Edward A Radcliff Scholarship. The scholarship was endowed by the late Geoffrey Angas Parsons in 1982. The College has a very long and strong association with the Angas Parsons family, a family of eminent academics and professionals in the science and legal
	areas and pastoralists.
Gavin Walkley Scholarship	This award is for a senior student who is academically capable, and actively upholds the College's values, including commitment to community service. The scholarship may take into account financial circumstances. The scholarship is given in memory of Gavin Walkley, an early student at St Mark's who later served as Chairman of the College Council (1961-1982).
Harold Fisher Scholarship	This was the first major scholarship in the College, and was established by Mr Harold Fisher in 1928. He said that his endowment "would help some of the best brains of South Australia to be members of the College but also extend the advantages of residential life to a succession of students who in most cases would be debarred by financial circumstances". It is awarded to South Australian students of high academic performance and/or to students from any background in financial need.
Harold Parsons Prize for Music	The Harold Parsons Prize for Music is awarded either for outstanding academic achievement in a Music course or for significant contribution to the musical life of the College.
Harron Scholarship	The Harron Scholarship was established in 2017 by Mr Trent Harron and recognises St Mark's students who are rendering service to the community, possibly but not necessarily in the Australian Defence Force.
Helen Reid Scholarship	This scholarship is awarded to a woman student in memory of the late Dr Helen Reid AM, who served on the Council and Board of the College, and was an Honorary Fellow of the College. Dr Reid was Principal of Walford Anglican School for Girls from 1972 to 1991.

lan and Pamela Wall Scholarships	The Ian and Pamela Wall Scholarships assist students of potential who are in need of financial support to be at St Mark's. Dr Ian Wall AM (1931-2022) was a resident student at St Mark's in 1950-54, and later a successful engineer, business leader, and philanthropist, and an Honorary Fellow of the College. In gratitude for all that St Mark's did for him, he and Dr Pamela Wall OAM became the largest ever donors to the College. The Ian and Pamela Wall Scholarships were created and first awarded in 2023.
Jeremy & Timothy Pascoe Scholarship	The Jeremy and Timothy Pascoe Scholarship is generously funded by two brothers, Jeremy and Timothy Pascoe, both of whom were resident members of the College. It is awarded to a senior student (e.g. third year returning for a fourth year) and takes into account academic performance and contribution to the College (e.g. in a leadership position).
John M Boully Scholarship	This scholarship, generously provided by Dr J M Boully, is awarded to a rural medical student each year who has a particular interest in aboriginal or rural health.
Julian Bickersteth Scholarships	A scholarship endowed by the Reverend Canon Julian Bickersteth, one of the most significant founders of the College, for students who are Old Collegians of St Peter's College, Adelaide. These scholarships may take into consideration an applicant's academic merit, community service, leadership, and extra-curricular activities. An applicant's financial situation may also be considered. Preference is given to new students.
Kitty Hayward Scholarship	This scholarship was created by Mrs Kitty Hayward, a strong supporter of the College, and mother of Lady Price, wife of the founding Master, Sir Archibald Grenfell Price. The primary criterion for this award is financial need. Other criteria which may be taken into account include character, intellectual ability, and participation in sport.
Kuchel Family Scholarship	The Kuchel Family Scholarship was created by Eve and Ivan Kuchel. The family legacies of integrity, problem solving, innovation, hard work, resilience and support of others and the community have been passed onto their children. This Scholarship is dedicated to the memory of their son, Ian Kuchel, a chemical engineering student at St Mark's from 1990 to 1992 who passed away in 2022. The Scholarship is awarded to a rural or regional student whose home is at least 100km from Adelaide, who will be in their second

	This scholarship was endowed to assist students to remain at the College who would otherwise have difficulty in doing so. The
Margaret and Harry Scott Scholarships	The Margaret and Harry Scott Scholarships have been generously endowed by the late Mrs Margaret Scott. They have been created to provide opportunities for female students who were born in and completed their secondary education within South Australia at a distance greater than 100km from Adelaide. These scholarships may also take into consideration an applicant's academic merit, service to the community, and leadership and extra-curricular activities.
	engineering with intention and ambition to pursue a career as a certified practising engineer. The Kuchel family legacy, and those qualities of Ian, are the key criteria for the scholarship awarded by the Head of College (following application by current students). These qualities are demonstrated in College students by being a talented and hard working student of good character who is actively involved in College life (including in team sport), with a strong focus on helping other students (possibly including current or future mentoring or tutoring of other students), and who has the ability to work well with others. Preference will be given to applicants who are strong in problem solving, inventiveness, and creativity, and who have the potential to be industry leaders. The Scholarship is awarded to a student for whom the Scholarship will make a significant difference to their ability to remain at the College. More than one Scholarship may be awarded in a year, and the Scholarship may be awarded each year up to a maximum of 3 years for individuals.

Michael Shearer Scholarship	The Michael Shearer Scholarship is for a student of Commerce who is of good academic standing, is in financial need, and makes a contribution to the College. The Scholarship (which may be shared) was first awarded for 2021, and is awarded in each year in which there is a suitable recipient. It was created through a bequest by a former Chair of the College Council, Mr Michael Shearer AM (1941- 2019).
Old Collegians' Association Bursaries	The College's alumni association, the Old Collegians' Association, generously funds two bursaries. Both bursaries are available to students who have a family member who was a Collegian (living or deceased), and who are in genuine financial need. One bursary is available only to an incoming first-year student of the College, and the other – created through a generous gift to the College by the Old Collegians' Association to mark the College's Centenary in 2025 – is for a student of any year at St Mark's.
Patrick and Bessie Greenland Scholarship	This scholarship to support a student of music was endowed by Mr Patrick Greenland MBE and Mrs Bessie Greenland. They were both keen to promote music in the College and also endowed the Greenland Music Room.
Postgraduate scholarships	The College welcomes postgraduate scholars (e.g., those studying for Masters degrees or PhDs), who are eligible for many of our scholarships. Scholarships are ordinarily awarded to postgraduate students on the basis of academic merit and financial need.
Programmed Scholarship	This scholarship, funded by the property services company Programmed, is awarded to a senior engineering student whose academic performance has been outstanding.
RB & PE Lewis Scholarship	The Lewis Scholarship is one of the highest honours in the College, and is awarded on the basis of academic excellence, contribution to community activities (at College and/or in the wider community), and financial need. This scholarship was endowed by the second Master of the College, Mr Robert Brook Lewis, and his wife Mrs Betty Lewis, who was also the daughter of the first Master of the College, Sir Archibald Grenfell Price.
Richard Watson Scholarship	The Richard Watson Scholarship was created in 2022 through a generous endowment by his family in memory of Richard Wyndham Watson (1936-2020), a plastic surgeon and Honorary Fellow of St Mark's College. The Scholarship is awarded to a

	student from regional Australia who is or will be studying medicine. It is awarded on the basis of academic excellence, commitment to service, and financial need, and may be awarded to either a new or returning student.
Robin Ashwin Scholarship	The Robin Ashwin Scholarship is for an excellent student whose studies have a strong international focus, and who is in financial need. The strong international focus could be, but does not need to be, in the study of international relations or international politics; it could be in any relevant field or fields of study, such as, for example, health, economics, history, law, development studies, or other fields. The Scholarship was created in 2020 through the generosity of the family of the late Charles Robin Ashwin (1930- 2019), former Master of the College (1991-99). It is intended for the Scholarship (which may be shared) to be awarded each year in which there is a suitable recipient.
Sholto Douglas Scholarship	The Sholto Douglas Scholarship is for senior medical students of outstanding ability who are in need of financial support.
Sir Keith Angas Essay Prize	Through the generosity of Sir Keith Angas (1900-77), a former Chair of the College Council and Honorary Fellow of the College, the Sir Keith Angas Essay Prize is offered for an annual essay competition.
Sir Ronald Fisher Medal and Ronald Fisher Scholarships	The Sir Ronald Fisher Medal and Scholarships were generously endowed by Emeritus Professor Peter Parsons, who was at the College from 1951 to 1955. The medal was first presented in 2008 and is given to the most outstanding student in the field of science. The Ronald Fisher Scholarships are awarded to outstanding science students.
St Mark's Entrance Scholarships	The St Mark's College Entrance Scholarships are valued at up to \$5,000 each. They are awarded to students from all backgrounds and locations. They may take into consideration an applicant's academic merit, financial need, community service, leadership, and musical or sporting or other extra-curricular activities.
St Peter's College/St Mark's College Bursary	This bursary is to assist a new student to enter St Mark's College from St Peter's College.

Studd Bursary	The Studd Bursary has been endowed by The Reverend John Studd and Mrs Nea Studd for students who are from an Indigenous background, a third world country, or refugees or asylum seekers in Australia.
Subject prizes	From time to time, the College awards prizes for outstanding performance at university in particular subjects.
Tatiara Collegians Scholarship	The Tatiara Collegians Scholarship is for a student (or students) from the Tatiara district of South Australia who may be either a new or returning student, is in financial need, and is a good student, and of good character. The scholarship was initiated and made possible through the generosity of Mr Mark Penniment.
The Women of St Mark's Scholarship	This scholarship for a female student returning for another year is awarded on the basis of academic excellence, contribution to the College, leadership, and financial need. It was created to acknowledge the contribution of resident women in our community when, in 2012, the College celebrated 30 years of women in residence at St Mark's. In 2022, St Mark's celebrated 40 years of co-education, and further donations were made to the scholarship.
Tim Brooks Scholarship	The Tim Brooks Scholarship, with a value of \$12,000 per annum, is open to any returning undergraduate student enrolled at St Mark's who is undertaking study in Agricultural Science (preferably) or Oenology or Viticulture in their second or later year. A student who is undertaking post-graduate study in any of these fields is also eligible to apply. The ideal candidate would be a student who has completed at least the first year of their course with higher than satisfactory achievement and has a commitment to their field of study. The intention of the scholarship is to provide the support for the student to be able to continue their studies at St Mark's College when this would otherwise be very difficult. In order of priority, the criteria for the award are: rural student, academic achievement and commitment, financial need, and contribution to the College or community. The scholarship is to be awarded to one student only at any one time. Previous recipients of the Scholarship are eligible to apply in subsequent scholarship rounds. The Tim Brooks Scholarship was generously created in 2024 by Timothy Brooks (St Mark's 1966-70).

	The recipient of this scholarship will share with the donor an information summary detailing their reasons for choosing this course of study, what they are learning and how they intend to apply this to their future career.
WA Collegians' Prize	This prize is awarded for excellence in science or science-related subjects (including agricultural science, dentistry, and medicine, as well as other branches of science). It was established in 1965 by J H (Josh) Reynolds, after the creation of a medical school at the University of Western Australia led to fewer students coming to St Mark's from WA to study medicine. Mr Reynolds was the first Rhodes Scholar from St Mark's (1929), and later long-time Warden of St George's College, UWA. The fund was increased in 2001 by Dr Geoffrey Morlet OAM RFD and more recently by Dr Peter Hurst.
WF Wehrstedt Bequest	This prize for a scholar in the Arts and Humanities was established in 1939 through a bequest from the Reverend W F Wehrstedt.

## External Scholarships and other financial support

C.A.S Hawker Scholarship	The <u>C.A.S Hawker Scholarship</u> is one of the most prestigious and generous privately funded awards in Australia and is administered by the Hawker Trustees. Interested applicants must apply directly to the trustees and complete an application form which can be accessed on their <u>website</u> . The Hawker Scholarships typically pay full College fees for up to three years. The Hawker Scholarships are given in memory of Charles Allan Seymour Hawker MP, a soldier, pastoralist and significant political leader, who was one of the founders of the College and served on the College Council until his death in an aeroplane crash in 1938. Playford Trust St Mark's College Residential STEM Scholarships	In partnership with the Playford Trust, St Mark's College is offering two scholarships for high-achieving and motivated South Australian students who are ready to commence an undergraduate degree in science, engineering, mathematics, or technology at any of the South Australian public universities. It is the hope of the Playford Trust and St Mark's College that these scholarships will help students overcome the practical and financial disadvantages associated with living away from home while at university. As such, each scholarship recipient will receive \$8,000 to go towards their College fees for one year. Applications for the Playford Trust St Mark's College Residential STEM Scholarships are administered by the Playford Trust. The Playford Trust will consider nominations from students who have accepted an offer of a place at St Mark's College for the relevant year, and also those who are recommended for selection by St Mark's College. To apply, students must be Australian citizens or holders of a permanent resident visa whose family base is in rural South Australia. They must also be intending to spend a significant part of their career in South Australia or be likely to contribute to the State's knowledge, skills, and research base. Scholarships will be awarded primarily based on academic merit. Consideration will also be given to applicants' financial need, personal character, and community contributions. Preference will be given to students who display leadership potential. Applications for this Scholarship must be made directly via <u>the</u> Playford Trust's website. The Playford Trust also offers a number of other scholarships for students from South Australia. We strongly encourage students to apply for all scholarships for which they may be eligible. Ivan Shearer Scholarship	A generous bequest from the late Professor Ivan Shearer AM (1938- 2019) enables St Mark's to provide significant scholarships for members of the College who go on to study at either Oxford or Cambridge (subject to certain terms).
